seal, and execute, all and every such receipts, acquit-
tances, releases, and discharges as my said attorney
shall see fit in that behalf, and to endorse and sign

my name to all drafts, bills, notes, or cheques made payable to my order .

And for the purposes aforesaid I do hereby give, and grant unto my said attorney full and absolute authority to do and perform, and execute all and every acts, deeds, matters, and things; and also to commence, institute and prosecute all actions, suits, and other proceedings which may be requisite and necessary or expedient to be done, commenced, instituted, or prosecuted in and about the premises as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as I could do if personally present and acting in the premises, with power to appoint a substitute or substitutes, for all or any of the purposes aforesaid and such substitution at pleasure to revoke, I the said Fannie A. Roney hereby ratifying and confirming and agreeing to ratify and confirm all and whatsoever my said attorney ^{John} ~~Lanton~~ ~~Johnston~~ ^{Bancelot Johnston} or such substitute or substitutes shall lawfully do or cause to be done, in or about the premises by virtue hereof
